

AIRC statement on Intellectual property

For inventions arising from an AIRC funded program, grant money can be used to cover the costs for filing a patent application within the European Union (EU), but not to extend a patent to non-EU countries. Intellectual property and patents resulting from research carried out with AIRC grants will be solely owned and managed by the grantees and the Hosting Institutions. All royalties and revenues deriving from the results of an AIRC grant must be reinvested in independent and non economic oncological research.

Drug supply and economic support from companies do not preclude AIRC evaluation, provided that the PI and/or GLs demonstrate to have the full property of data and results, and that companies have no right to veto the publication of results at any time.
